- A business-friendly, on-line tool that provides a single, easily-accessible source of information
- Operates through a series of drop down menus
- Meets the needs of individual services providers.

- Why the services sector?
- Increases the transparency of rules and regulations affecting market access
- Centralises widely dispersed information in a single repository
- Presents it in a user-friendly way

How was it developed?



Asia-Pacific
Economic Cooperation

- Phase 1 – Australian-funded, five economies, five services sectors completed 2010
- Phase 2 – Jointly funded by Australia and APEC, expanded to cover 11 APEC economies, completed 2011
- Phase 3 – Jointly funded by Australia and APEC, covers *all* APEC economies, *three* new services sectors for 15 economies, completed end 2012.
